## Commencement Speaker

The Honorable Edward J. Markey  
*Senator from Massachusetts*

U.S. Senator Edward J. Markey has deep roots in the Bay State. Markey was born and raised in Malden, Massachusetts. His father drove a truck for the Hood Milk Company, where he worked his way up to supervisor. His mother graduated first in her high school class. In addition to transmitting their strong work ethic to their son, Markey's parents instilled in him the values that guide him: fairness, honesty, integrity and giving back to the community and to the country.

Markey has worked for decades in the public arena. A veteran Congressman from Massachusetts, Markey served for 37 years in the U.S. House of Representatives and for three years in the Massachusetts House of Representatives. In 2013 he won a seat in the U.S. Senate in a special election held to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of John F. Kerry, who now serves as Secretary of State.

Markey is regarded as a leader on energy, environmental protection and telecommunications policy. He is a member of the U.S. Senate Committee on Foreign Relations, where he serves as Chairman of the Subcommittee on International Development and Foreign Assistance, Economic Affairs, International Environmental Protection and the Peace Corps. In addition, Markey serves on the U.S. Senate Committees on Commerce, Science and Transportation and Small Business and Entrepreneurship. In recognition of his national leadership on environmental issues, Markey was named Chair of the Senate Climate Change Clearinghouse.

Markey was the first in his family to attend college. He drove an ice cream truck to support himself while earning his B.A. at Boston College. Markey went on to receive a J.D. from Boston College Law School. Upon graduation from law school, he worked as a lawyer in private practice. Markey was a member of the U.S. Army Reserve. He is the recipient of numerous awards including honorary doctorates for his contributions to improving the lives of people in Massachusetts and America. In his home state, the Senator is well known for his enthusiastic support of the New England Patriots, the Boston Red Sox, the Boston Celtics and the Boston Bruins.

## Trustees' Distinguished Service Awardee

William T. Sakamoto  
*Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs and Enrollment Services*

William Sakamoto has served Bunker Hill Community College for 36 years in a wide range of capacities, progressing from front-line and managerial duties to crucial leadership roles. Widely known as a leader with an extraordinary understanding and ability to advise, mentor and advocate for students, Sakamoto has served as Associate Vice President of Academic Affairs and Enrollment Services since February 2011. He has been a kind and mindful colleague to faculty, staff and administrators, and an exemplar in urban community college leadership in all aspects of educational services.

Sakamoto's long service to the College began in March 1978—just five years after the College opened—when he joined BHCC as a staff assistant in the Learning Center. He held four positions there, progressing to Director. Beginning in August 1991 he held three leadership positions in Academic Support Services, ending his tenure as Dean. From January 2001 until he assumed his current position, he was Dean of BHCC Online/Weekend College.

Sakamoto led the Enrollment Management group during a period of tremendous growth. He led the implementation and growth of distance education and directed and implemented the College's East Boston and Malden sites. He implemented LifeMap. He has provided administrative leadership and faculty collaboration in programmatic and curricular development. He has been instrumental in creating partnerships with community-based organizations and school districts to further pathways programs, boot camps and summer bridges for entering students. When he retires in June 2014, Bill Sakamoto will leave an indelible legacy of major accomplishments.

## President's Distinguished Service Awardee

Beverly A. Morgan-Welch

*Executive Director, Museum of African American History*

Beverly A. Morgan-Welch is the recipient of the President's Distinguished Service Award for her exemplary commitment to shaping a future of knowledge and hope for Bunker Hill Community College students and for her numerous contributions to preserving history in Boston.

Morgan-Welch is Executive Director of the Museum of African American History, located on Boston's Beacon Hill and in Nantucket, Massachusetts. Under her leadership the Museum has contributed significantly to the College. This has included the development of a dynamic and reciprocal partnership that has provided BHCC students with community-based, culturally relevant learning experiences that deepen scholarship and foster success.

In February 2014 at the Achieving the Dream Institute, Morgan-Welch co-presented with BHCC faculty and staff on embedding culturally responsive pedagogy into learning communities. In 2013-2014, the Museum collaborated with BHCC faculty members to design culturally responsive curricula for students. In October 2013 at the University of Massachusetts Amherst's 4th Annual New England Conference for Student Success, Morgan-Welch co-presented with BHCC on infusing local history and culture into the curriculum.

In addition to her work with the Museum, Morgan-Welch has worked in nonprofit management and corporate philanthropy for three decades. She is a graduate of Smith College and a recipient of the Smith College Medal. Morgan-Welch, who is the widow of Reverend Mark Welch, lives in Andover, Massachusetts, with her daughter.
